## 2018 Farm Bill: ARC/PLC

2024 ARCPLC Program is an extension 2018 Farm Bill

Two programs:

--Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC)

-- Price Loss Coverage (PLC)



### **ARCPLC Basic Provisions**

22 Covered Commodities

ARC program offers income support when guarantee revenues are not met for selected covered commodities

#### Two Options under ARC program

- ARC-CO: County Level Loss Coverage
- ARC-IC: Individual Level Loss Coverage



### **ARCPLC Basic Provisions**

#### **ARC-County:**

- protects against crop revenue shortfalls
- price and/or production declines per covered commodity
- at the "COUNTY" level

#### **ARC-Individual Coverage:**

- protects against crop revenue shortfalls
- price and/or Production declines across
- ALL covered commodities planted at the "Farm" level across ALL farms enrolled in ARC-IC in the STATE



### **ARCPLC Basic Provisions**

#### **Price Loss Coverage**

 Provides an income support when effective price of covered commodity is below the "effective reference" price set by statue (Price Protection)

Decline in "production" is NOT covered under PLC



# **ARCPLC Basic Provisions Program Comparison**

PLC	ARC-CO	ARC-IC
Uses Price plus PLC Yield	Uses Price Plus "County" Level Yield	Uses Price Plus Producer's yield on the farm(s)
Payment determined by individual covered commodity crop base acres	Payment determined by individual covered commodity crop base acres	Payment determined by all crops planted of covered commodities combined on the farm(s) in the State



## **ARCPLC Basic Provisions Program Comparison**

PLC	ARC-CO	ARC-IC
Payments made on 85% of specific crop based on farm	Payments made on 85% of specific crop base acres on farm	Payments made on 65% of TOTAL base acres on farm
Production report NOT required	Production report NOT required	Requires annual Production report of all covered commodities planted



# **ARCPLC Basic Provisions Program Comparison**

PLC	ARC-CO	ARC-IC
Planting of covered commodities  NOT  required	Planting of covered commodities NOT required	Planting of covered commodities REQUIRED
Elect by Covered Commodity Base Acres by farm	Elect by Covered Commodity Base Acres by farm	Elect on ALL Covered Commodities on the farm
May mix ARC-CO and PLC on same farm by base crop	May mix ARC-CO and PLC on same farm by base crop	ARC-CO and PLC not eligible on farm



## ARCPLC BASIC PROVISION Contract Requirements

- ARC-CO and PLC, producers are required to designate shares and sign a contract for farms enrolled
- ARC-IC, producers sharing in covered commodities on farm enrolled are required to sign a contract
  - Payment shares will be determined by using the producer shares of all covered commodities certified (FSA-578) on the ARC-IC enrolled farm



### **2024 ARC/PLC**

Signup Began: December 18, 2023

Signup Ends: March 15, 2024



- Enrollment will occur on a covered commodity-by-covered commodity base acre crop basis
- If an election is not submitted by the deadline of March 15, 2024, the election defaults to the current election for crops on farm from the prior year
- To be eligible for payments, producers must <u>annually enroll</u> their respective share interest of covered commodity base acres.



## Important ARCPLC Deadlines

- March 15, 2024 Enrollment and Election Deadline
- July 15, 2024 Deadline to report planted acres
- July 15, 2024 Deadline to report production for ARC-IC for 2023 ARC-IC enrolled farms
- September 30, 2024 Deadline to sign any contract revisions, successions, and late-files
- Early October 2025 once Marketing Year Average (MYA) price has been determined payments for 2024 will be paid



### Why March 15<sup>th</sup>?

This date closely aligns with RMA sales closing dates for:

- Enhanced Coverage Option (ECO)
- Supplemental Coverage Option (SCO)
- Stacked Income Protection Plan for Upland Cotton (STAX)



ECO, SCO, & STAX are all RMA programs which USDA does not have any control over...

ECO is not affected by enrollment in the ARCPLC program

- To be eligible for SCO
  - Producers cannot be enrolled in ARC
- To be eligible for STAX
  - Producer cannot enroll Seed Cotton base acres
